Span-301- Composition/Oral practice (completed in Fall 2013)

This course meets MLO 1: Language proficiency and MLO 2: Language and Linguistic Knowledge. This course meets MLO 1: Language proficiency and MLO 3: Literary and Cultural Knowledge. This course contributes to fulfillment of MLO 1 because we mainly practiced our reading skills, speaking ability, and listening ability by reading a lot of literature pieces, novels, stories, poems, and participating in group activities, class discussions, class presentations. The first half of the class was literature and the second part was poetry. Span 301S- Service learning in Latino Community (completed Fall 2013)

This course meets MLO 1 Language Proficiency and MLO 3 Literary and Cultural Knowledge. The reasons why this course meets the fulfillment of these two MLO's are the following.
